
Correspondence

Harry spoke about three items of inwards correspondence (see Annex B for full list).

81 was our insurance quote from Marsh, the company arranged by Anzac House for all RSL sub-branches. We are covered for \$300,000 building and \$30,000 contents. The Committee is making arrangements about the adequacy of those amounts. Harry said that he had asked other clubs about their arrangements. Colac for example occupies a heritage-listed cinema building.

Their insurance is based on \$10,000,000 replacement value with an annual premium in excess of \$50K per annum.

- 85 was an invitation from Libby Coker for a meeting with the Federal Minister for Veteran Affairs, Matt Keogh at the Ocean Grove RSL premises. The topic was the Veterans and Families Hub proposal. The Geelong hub is likely to open mid-2025, run by RSL Victoria. The meeting was attended by Denis Hyland, Derek Haayema and Harry Paterson.

Where is the name Gladys Patricia Bishop?
